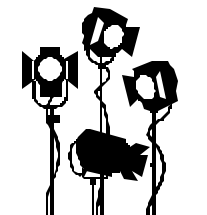

Gateway was selected to receive the 2004 National Storytelling Network Regional Leadership and Service Award. This award is presented to individuals or organizations that have made a significant contribution to their local or regional storytelling community and/or have used storytelling to make a significant contribution to the larger community in which they live. Nan Kamman-Judd placed Gateway’s name in nomination.

Sue Hinkel, Gateway member, accepted the award (a plaque) on behalf of the Gateway membership at the special Oracle Awards ceremony on Saturday, July 10, 2004 in the Concert Hall of the Performing Arts Center on the campus of Western Washington University in Bellingham, WA. This ceremony was held during the July National Storytelling Conference in Bellingham, WA. A picture was taken with the presenter, Joyce Slater—NSN Board of Directors—from Kansas City.
